Outdoor Gathering and Meeting



In Memory Of

It is with great sadness that the Kitimat Gyro Club lost one it's long time members Ken "Rin Tin" Minifie on March 9, 2020.

Ken was in Gyro for over 42 years from 2077 until 2020, Past President in 1984 and 2002. He will be fondly remembered as a great friend, committed Gyro and all round class guy.

Ken was a veteran of the Second World War and a true hero of his generation. During the war he flew missions over Europe as a wireless operator in the Halifax bombers. Sometime in 1944 his plane was shot down over The Netherlands and Ken spent the remaining duration of the war as a prisoner of war.

At wars end, Ken obtained his engineering degree and landed in Kitimat working for the Aluminum Company of Canada preparing for the start of up the Kitimat aluminium smelter in 1954. In 2015, Ken was a guest of honour at the smelter and pulled the disconnect turning off the power to the last remaining potline in the old smelter.

At 63 years of continuous Royal Canadian Legion membership, Ken was the senior member of the Kitimat Branch. Many years ago, Ken was awarded a Life Membership in the Legion. Twice a week or more, up to his passing, Ken continued his regular visits to the Legion Lounge where he could be seen hoisting a beer with his friends. A proud Legion member to the very end.

The Kitimat Gyro Club will be making a donation to the Royal Canadian Legion on behalf of Ken.

Condolences and best wishes go out to Kens's family and friends.



August 31, 1922 – March 9, 2020 Ken passed away peacefully on Mar 9 in Kitimat General Hospital at the age of 97.

He leaves behind many friends and family members who will dearly miss him. Predeceased by his loving wife Sis after fifty six years of marriage, his grandson Jamle, his 7 siblings and his parents Elizabeth and Henry. Ken is survived by his 3 children; Wayne (Janette), David (Elaine) and Debbie (Jack), his 6 grandchildren and 4 great grandchildren. He was born in Spillimacheene BC where his Dad worked for the CPR railway, From a young age he was a

great outdoor enthusiast and played many team sports. On one of these trips he met Lillian (Sis) who would become his future bride. Early in 1940 Ken enlisted in the Armed Forces and after training in the RCAF was sent overseas where he flew several bombing missions over Germany before he was shot down and Captured.

After 18 months in a prisoner of war camp, he was freed by the Russians and returned home.

He married his sweetheart Sis in 1945 and that same year he enrolled in Metallurgical Engineering at UBC. After graduating he joined Alcan Smelters working at the Arvida plant in Quebec, but soon thereafter he returned to BC where he would startup the first pots of the new Kitimat smelter.

Ken was an active community member and joined several organizations including; Gyros, Masonic Lodge, Yacht Club, Minor Hockey, Cross Country Ski Club, and the Claque Mountain Ski Hill building group to name a few. He was always ready to volunteer his time for a worthy cause. He also enjoyed time at the Lakelse cabin watching the grand kids swim.

In his later years, his efforts went to playing pool and discussing politics at the Kitimat Legion. He lived life to the fullest and will be sadly missed by family and friends.

A special thanks go to Emma and Sarah for taking such good care of him at home. The family would also like to extend their thanks to Dr. Kay, Dr. Skuily, Kitimat Fire & Ambulance Services, and the nursing staff at Kitimat General Hospital.

Many thanks to the Legion, Kitimat Masons and Gyro members who helped with his service.











